

## Firearms Training for Law Enforcement Movement/Transitional Shooting – Night Qualification

This course is open to all sworn Patrol personnel.

Attendees can expect a range discussion where both Federal and State of Idaho laws will be reviewed regarding the use of deadly force. Firearm decisions and handling will be covered, to include movement drills, multiple threats, and public awareness/safety. Attendees can expect to move with full equipment, respond from a seated position from a patrol vehicle, and address targets from non-conventional shooting platforms. At the conclusion of this training a night qualification will be administered. The following will be specifically discussed/presented:
